# From the Pastor ~~

And the disciples were called Christians.

—Acts 11:26

In the third century Cyprian, the Bishop of Carthage, wrote to his friend Donatus, "It is a bad world, Donatus, an incredibly bad world. But I have discovered in the midst of it a quiet and holy people, who have learned a great secret. They have found a joy which is a thousand times better than any of the pleasures of our sinful life. They are despised and persecuted, but they care not. They are masters of their souls. They have overcome the world. These people, Donatus, are Christians . . . and I am one of them."

We often times think things are bad because of the news. In the third century AD, they were saying the same thing. Cyprian wrote to a friend about a group of people who viewed the world differently. They were the Christians. Christians are not perfect, just forgiven.

We acknowledge that all things are under God's control. Because of that, we have overcome the world. As a result of that, we do not fear the news, when bad things happen to ourselves or someone close to us. We lay all of our troubles at the feet of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Good Shepherd Church Council met on August 13 with the following members in attendance: Brian Walker, Michelle Walker, Larry Hill, Kevin Weber, Johannah Pollert, Pastor Daene, Don Haddock, Shelley Hill and Rose Krimmel. Those absent were: Randy Powers, Kent Krimmel, Gerda Martin, Amy Houck and Heidi Baca.

The meeting was opened by President Brian Walker and asked Pastor Daene to say a prayer.

Johannah Pollert, Council Secretary, presented the minutes from our June meeting. Motion made to accept as presented. Approved.

Rose Krimmel, Financial Secretary, presented June income as \$11, 535.72 and July income as \$14,187.71.

Larry Hill. Treasurer, presented our expenses for June as \$15,378.13 and July as \$12,197.56.

Pastor reported we had an average of 64 in attendance in June and 46 in July. He had 8 Church services; 18 Bible studies; 3 Visits; 3 Visiting visitors; 4 Hospital visits and 17 Counseling sessions.

Kevin Weber, Deacon Chair, would like someone in the congregation to volunteer to help with the music during our services. If you are interested, see Kevin Weber.

Don Haddock, Trustee Chairman, reported that the ceiling tiles will be painted until the roof is repaired or replaced. He is getting quotes on both. The outside trimming maintenance continues. He would like to do another Clean-up of the church like we did in the Spring. More on

Michelle Walker, Mission Chair, reported we had 34 pounds of canned food and to ilet paper collected for the InterChurch Food Pantry in July. Also, our Back to School supplies was a big success, The President of the Chordlighters is going to get back to her with some dates for a program. Our Ride Share Program is still available to any member that needs a ride to and from church.

Our next meeting will be September 10th after the worship service.
