

From the Pastor

As I looked through the many and various lessons of the Advent season, the Bible attributes many names to Jesus. There are over 100 names in the Bible associated with Him. While today we do not think about what our names mean, in Biblical times it was common to give a second or even a third title to someone based on who they were or what their mission was. In several places, God renamed people. For instance, he named "Peter" when his name had been "Simon". Peter means "rock" and upon Peter's public statement who Jesus was, the church would be built. Jesus renamed "Saul" to become "Paul" which means humble or small. Certainly, Paul would be humbled by the Lord but was also used to be a great missionary.

Jesus has many names and titles. In one place, He is described as a submissive lamb, but also as a conquering lion. In the Advent season, we sing about "Immanuel" which means God with us. That is a powerful description of who He is and what His mission is. Jesus is not someone we have to seek and find. He is here with us. Unlike the ancients who thought that the gods were bound geographically and had to wake up to hear, Jesus is with His people. He said, "where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there also."

That doesn't mean we should view him as just a friend or my best friend forever (BBF in today's lingo). Even at His birth, He was leading. He led the shepherds and wise men to see Him. In the temple at age 12, He amazed the religious leaders with His questions and understanding. He led the disciples and taught them and the people about what it means to live in God's kingdom. He explained to them that He must die for the sins of all people.

Advent is when we prepare our hearts for the coming of the King of the Universe, the Lord God Almighty. He came to redeem His people and to conquer sin, death and the Devil. When we sing about Immanuel, we are proclaiming the King has arrived, and He will disrupt the world order. As we begin the Advent season, look at the names attributed to Jesus and learn how His names tell us what He is all about.

Church Council Highlights ~~

Good Shepherd Church Council met on November 5 after worship service. Those present were Jeff Hawkins, Anne Hartman, Johannah Pollert, Mike Peters, Susan Sego Gerda Martin, Amy Houck, Heidi Baca, Joyce Bauman, Kevin Weber, Pastor Daene, Kathy Hawkins, and Kent Krimmel. Guest Rose Krimmel.

The meeting was called to order by Mike Peters and a prayer was given by Kent Krimmel.

The minutes were reviewed and accepted with corrections.

Joyce, Financial Secretary, gave the report for October as follows: Offerings \$15,524.28; Miscellaneous \$61.44; Sunday School \$108.50; and Thrivent \$88.00.

Anne, Treasurer, reported expenses for October were \$13,763.71 and the mortgage balance as \$194,583.04.

Pastor reported the average attendance for October was 70. He had 5 Worship Services; 3 Confirmation classes; 2 Church

meetings; 8 Adult Bible Studies; 4 Member visits; 2 Shut-in visits; 7 Counseling sessions; 3 Non-member visits; and 12 Hospital visits. Winterjam for the Youth Group is February 11. Advent starts December 3.

No Deacon report.

Paul, Trustee chairman, stated he had taken the Coliform & Nitrate water samples in on October 31. The Dixie Chopper was repaired as it had a hydraulic leak. Heidi, Chairman of Christian Education reported the Sunday School classes are teaching the Old Testament. They continue to go to Hickory Creek Nursing Home on the second Sunday of the month. Adult Bible studies will be on break from Thanksgiving until the beginning of the new year. We had around 70 children for the GSLC Fall Festival and great participation from the congregation. We continue to need volunteers to attend the nursery.

No Stewardship report.

Susan, Co-chair Missions reported they are looking for another Missionary. The new church pamphlet is being reviewed. The Christmas church services ad for the Daily Journal was decided. Randy & Elaine will be in charge of The Christmas Angel Program again this year. We are to have two families. The Franklin Community Band was here in October and will be back in March. The last Thursday of the month a group will volunteer at Orphan Grain Train. Contact Anne if you need to carpool.

Amy, Co-Chair for Fellowship/Special Events reported everything was donated for October pitch-in.

Budget tweaks were decided during discussion and Council approved. It is ready for the voter's meeting.

A change to the By-Laws was discussed and approved.
