From the Pastor

I read an interesting story and thought I would share it here because I see a connection between it and the upcoming Lenten season. Several years ago, the St. Charles Avenue Christian Church in New Orleans, which is affiliated with the Disciples of Christ denomination, had a serious fire in the sanctuary. In the pre-dawn darkness after the fire was extinguished the assistant fire chief, a Roman Catholic, wandered into the church to inspect the damage to the ceiling. Looking upward with his flashlight he failed to notice where he was stepping. Suddenly he tripped over something on the floor and fell into the church's baptistry. Ironically it was filled with water from the fire hoses. Pulling himself out, the assistant fire chief stumbled and sputtered into the street. He noticed the fire department chaplain coming by and he asked, "Father, who are those people in there?" The chaplain replied, "They're the Disciples of Christ." The chief, still soaked from his plunge into the baptistry, responded, "Well Father, I don't know anything about them but it looks like I'm one of them

now."

On Ash Wednesday, we will have a similar thing that will make us look alike. We will have the sign of the cross on our foreheads. For those of us who were baptized as infants, the sign of the cross was made on our foreheads and hearts. Ash Wednesday is a reminder of our baptismal cross on our foreheads. Ash Wednesday also reminds us that we came from ashes and we will return to be ashes. That might seem morbid at first, but the ashes are in the sign of the cross. That reminds us that because Jesus died on the cross, the grave is not the end. Ash Wednesday begins the time of year when we begin that final journey of Jesus to Jerusalem and His victorious resurrection on Easter morning.



GSLC Church Council met on January 10 at 7 p.m. Those in attendance were Chris Johnson, Mike Peters, Susan Sego, Anne Hartman, Angela Coy, Johannah Pollert, Pastor Daene, Gerda Martin, Paul Cox, Kent Krimmel, Kevin Weber, Randy Powers. Absent were Heidi Baca, Jeff Hawkins, Amy Houck and Joyce Bauman.

Chris Johnson, President asked Pastor to open the meeting with a prayer.

Minutes were reviewed from the November meeting and approved.

Financial Report was reviewed, as Joyce was absent with the flu, offerings for December were \$33,034.28.

Anne Hartman, gave the Treasurer's report for December. Expenses were \$14,819.31. Mortgage balance is \$190,102.72.

Pastor reported the average attendance for December was 78. He had 12 church services; 2 Church meetings; 2 Confirmation classes; 8 Bible studies; 1 Shut-in visit; 3 non-member visits; 5 Hospital visits; and 3 member visits from Christmas Around the World. The Youth will be going to the Winter Jam concert on February 10.

Paul Cox reported he keeps a check on the water softener and chlorination system. He has changed furnace filters that were due and cleaned out the gutters. Orkin, pest control, came and did a complete pest treatment of the church. Tom Pfaehler will continue to do the snow removal.

Fellowship –Special Events reported that the total expenses for the year 2017 were \$477.91.

No other reports.

Old Business: Things we will continue with in 2018—(1) Get the steeple painted; and (2) Soundproofing Fellowship Hall.

New Business: Still need a Council Secretary and a Stewardship Chairman.

A discussion ensued regarding "What Stewardship Is?" An article will be written for the newsletter.

We would like to get a Church Directory completed this year. Anyone wanting to volunteer to help, let Rose know. Then we will have a meeting and get started.
