Those present were: Mike Peters, Paul Cox, Kent Krimmel, Gerda Martin, Susan Sego, Kathy Hawkins, Jeff Hawkins, Johannah Pollert, Kevin Weber, Anne Hartman and guest Rose Krimmel. Those absent were Pastor Daene, Joyce Bauman, Amy Houck and Heidi Baca.

The meeting was brought to order by Mike Peters, President. Paul Cox gave a prayer.

The minutes from the March meeting were reviewed and accepted with a correction.

The Financial Secretary's report was reviewed. The total giving for March was \$12,224.41 and April's was \$16,893.86.

Treasurer's Report by Anne Hartman showed expenses for April as \$14,054.19.
