Good Shepherd Church Council met on Sunday, February 11, after the worship service due to Lent services on Wednesday evenings.

Those present were Chris Johnson, Kent Krimmel, Gerda Martin, Susan Sego, Joyce Bauman, Pastor Daene, Larry Hill, Kevin Weber, Heidi Baca, Johannah Pollert, Angela Coy, Randy Powers and guest, Rose Krimmel. Those absent wereJeff Hawkins, Sharon Peters, and Amy Houck.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Daene.

President Chris started the meeting with our new secretary, Johannah Pollert and new Stewardship Chairman, Larry Hill to. be approved by the Council. Also, Mike Peters stepped down as Trustee Chairman. If interested in this position, please speak to a Council member.

Minutes were reviewed and approved with a correction to the offerings received in December. The new total is \$33,240.78 for

December 2017.

Financial Secretary, Joyce, explained the correction to December offerings and stated that January offerings were \$15,173.80.

Treasurer, Angela, gave the January expenses as \$12,900.56. Mortgage balance was \$187,237.40.

Pastor reported the average attendance for January was 77. He had 4 Church services, attended 2 Church meetings, had 3 Confirmation classes, 3 Adult Confirmation classes, 7 Adult Bible studies and other studies, did 4 Member visits, 2 Shut-in visits, 9 Nonmember visits, and 4 Hospital visits.

Deacon chairman, Kevin, announced we are going to do attendance sheets again to track attendance.

Trustee Chairman, vacant at this time. Christian Education chairman, Heidi Baca, stated Sunday School classes are doing a new curriculum called "Dig In". They are studying the Life of Jesus. They continue to go to Hickory Creek and are planning their Easter Event.

Stewardship Chairman, Larry, said he is going to work on getting members involved. Missions Committee, Susan stated they met on January 21 with 3 people in attendance. Elaine Powers received a thank you note from the families we helped through the Christmas Angel Tree. We will continue to collect for the Interchurch Food Pantry. Planning a clothing drive for Orphan Grain Train and have the Community Band in April.

Fellowship—Special Events, Gerda, reported that there were no expenses for the January Pitch-in; everything was donated.

Council is still working on getting a company to paint the steeple this Spring/Summer and soundproofing Fellowship Hall.
