# From the Pastor

While I drive to or between visits I often listen to the radio. The other day, Coach Tony Dungee was telling a story about former Cowboys quarterback Troy Aikman. Aikman could have thrown far more yards than he did in his career but he let his star running back, Emmitt Smith, carry the ball. Smith is one of the greatest running backs of all time. Coach Dungee's point was that Aikman was such a good team player that he let others shine.

I would like to take Coach Dungee's observation a bit further. In John 3, we read that John the Baptist's disciples were coming to him and telling him that so many people were going to hear Jesus of Nazareth and John's disciples were concerned. You can hardly blame them since they believed (rightly) that John was preaching the Word of God to the people and calling them to repentance. If so many were going to hear Jesus, who would hear John. If John had been like many people, he would have let his popularity go to his head and he would thought more of himself than he should have. John replies to his disciples, "You yourselves are my witnesses that I said, 'I am not the Christ,' but, 'I have been sent ahead of Him.' "He who has the bride is the bridegroom; but the friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly because of the bridegroom's voice. So this joy of mine has been made full. "He must increase, but I must decrease."

John understood his role was to get everything ready for Jesus and then step back. John's role was not to promote himself or make a name for himself. Jesus was to take center stage and everyone needed to listen to Him. The people could not do that if they were still following John and only listening to him. When John was imprisoned by King Herod, John sent his disciples to Jesus. John knew his time was short and he wanted his disciples to follow Jesus.

John is a great lesson for all of us. We all work for the same Lord and we have one purpose. That purpose is to build up the believers in their faith and to make Christ known to all people. Our role is not to make everyone notice us but to pay attention to the One that sends us into the world to have all pay attention to Him.
