

## Church Council Highlights ~ ~

Good Shepherd Church Council met on September 13 at 7:00 pm. Those in attendance were: Kent Krimmel, Susan Sego, Jeff Hawkins, Anne Hartman, Kathy Hawkins, Pastor Daene, Joyce Bauman, Gerda Martin, Paul Cox, and Kevin Weber. Those absent were: Mike Peters, Johannah Pollert and Heidi Baca.

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer given by Kent Krimmel.

The August minutes were reviewed and approved with corrections.

The Financial Secretary reported the income from August was \$12,261.97.

The Treasurer reported the expenses for August were \$16,891.30.

Pastor stated the average attendance for August was 70. He had taken the first eight days of August as vacation as his daughter Rachel got married that week.

He held 3 church services; 1 church meeting; 6 Adult Bible studies and other classes; 1 member visit; 1 shut-in visit; 2 non-member visits; 4 hospital visits; and 6 counseling sessions. Plans are under way for the Youth group, Child Confirmation and Adult Confirmation classes.

Trustee Chairman, Paul Cox, reported the parking lot and driveway was sealcoated and parking lot striped. We had to have the sink drains in the kitchen roto-rooted out by a plumber. He did the 3rd Qtr. water sample and sent it in. And he continues to monitor the chlorination system.

The Stewardship Report shows that giving is down compared to 2015 and 2016.

The Deacons did not have a meeting and no report.

Board of Missions co-chair Susan Sego stated that they are working on setting a date for a meeting.

Gerda Martin, co-chairman of the Fellowship-Special Events reported the expenses for the picnic were \$67.88. Gerda thanked the Hawkins' and the Krimmel's for helping to set up and tear down tables and etc. for the church picnic.

The Board of Christian Education report showed that the Fall Sunday school started on August 27. They are studying the Old Testament. The children continue to go to Hickory Creek Nursing Home on the second Sunday of the month. The Bible Study classes continue on their specified days.

## Deacon's Notes ~ ~ Mike Hartman

The 95 Theses—A Little History —

Committed to the idea that salvation could be reached through faith and by divine grace only, Luther vigorously objected to the corrupt practice of selling indulgences. Acting on this belief, he wrote the "Disputation on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences", also known as "The 95 Theses", a list of questions and propositions for debate. Popular legend has it that on October 31, 1517 Luther defiantly nailed a copy of his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle church. The reality was proba-

bly not so dramatic; Luther more likely hung the document on the door of the church matter-of-factly to announce the ensuing academic discussion around it that he was organizing.

The 95 Theses, which later become the foundation of the Protestant Reformation, were written in a remarkably humble and academic tone, questioning rather than accusing. The overall thrust of the document was nonetheless quite provocative. The first two of the theses contained Luther's central idea, that God intended be-

lievers to seek repentance and the faith alone, and not deeds, would lead to salvation. The other 93 theses, a number of them directly criticizing the practice of indulgences, supported these first two.

This month we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the reformation, the beginning of the Lutheran Church. May we always be aware that salvation is through faith and by divine grace alone and not of our own works.

## Church Council Positions Open for Election

It is that time of year when we start to think about electing members to the Church Council. The terms of the President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Trustee Chairman, Stewardship Chairman and one Member-at-Large are up for election. Each term is two years. If you are interested in running for any of these positions contact Kent Krimmel at 317-346-6199.

This month the duties of the Trustee Chairman, Stewardship Chairman, and one Member-at-Large will be printed.

Trustee Chairman - The Board of Trustees shall consist of the chairman and three (or more) members.. They shall:

- A. Inspect and supervise maintenance of all the church's properties and make recommendations accordingly;
- B. Recommend regulations governing the use of the church's properties;
- C. Issue and recall keys for the church's property, keeping a list of such keys and annually reviewing such list;
- D. Plan, enlist and supervise crews for special repairs, property improvements, etc. as the need arises;
- E. Draw up contracts, accept and receive grants and bequests, and all other business of the congregation as assigned to them by the Voter's Assembly;
- F. Maintain an up-to-date inventory of all the church's equipment and property;
- G. Submit annually to the Church Council an insurance program to properly protect the organization;
- H. Develop all policies and fees for rental, use, and lending of the church's properties and;
- I. Submit an annual budget to the Board of Stewardship as requested by the Board.

Stewardship Chairman—Shall consist of five or more members; i.e., the elected Chairman of the Board, the Financial Secretary, the Treasurer, and additional members of the congregation. They shall:

- A. Discover the talents of the membership and enlist them in the congregation's programs;
- B. Sponsor stewardship and mission talks, discussions, conferences, etc. in the congregation and in all of its organizations;
- C. Work in close cooperation with the Circuit and District Stewardship entities;
- D. Instruct the people in the grace of proportionate giving to God's work in their own parish and in the world;
- E. Supervise the raising of all funds in the congregation
- F. Keep the Pastor, the Church Council, and all Boards informed as to the financial standing of the church to ensure efficient expenditure of all funds on hand and;
- G. Prepare the annual proposed budget for submission to the December Voter's Assembly.

Member-at-Large —

As a Member-at-Large you shall assist the Church Council as deemed necessary by the council. This may be researching a proposed project, assisting a council member, collating information and etc.
