From the Pastor

James 4:11 tells us not to slander anyone. That verse is used in Luther's explanation of the 8th commandment, "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor". Most of the ads tell us that this candidate is rotten. lies, and imports from China, or doesn't import and therefore we should vote for this one. I suppose this is another reason that I cannot run for political office because I purchase ship model parts from Russia. So much of what I see in political ads goes against so much of what the Bible calls us to be.

Luther explains the 8th commandment with these words, "We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way". The last part of the commandment can be hard to do at times, but it is the best way to defuse anger. Maybe that sales clerk is not just

an angry person but is one who has had to deal with a rude customer. Maybe I should not be too critical of that driver speeding in the morning because I too, have left later than I should have.

Proverbs 15:1 says, "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." I have noticed over the years that God's commands are meant to bring civility and calmness to situations which leads to true justice rather than harshness which seldom leads to anything good. Once we let our sinful human nature dictate our interaction with other people, it leads to more sin. I cannot change politicians and their ads and campaigns have been as vicious since 1824 onward. However, with God's help we can strive to live out how God commands us to be.

Church Council Highlights ~~

Good Shepherd's Church Council met on October 14, 2018 after our worship service. Those in attendance were: Amy Houck, Johannah Pollert, Kent Krimmel, Chris Johnson, Mike Peters, Jeff Hawkins, Joyce Bauman, Larry Hill, Randy Powers, and Pastor Daene, Those absent were Kevin Weber, Heidi Baca, Angela Coy, Susan Sego, Sharon Peters, and Gerda Martin.

Pastor Daene opened the meeting with a prayer. Roll call was taken by Chris.

The Secretary's minutes from the last meeting were reviewed and were accepted by a motion and vote.

The Financial Secretary's report was given and offerings for September were \$13,240.87. Accepted as reported. Giving is down compared to last year at this time.

The Treasurer was absent but sent a report. It was reviewed and any questions were to be kept and ask her at the next meeting.

Pastor gave his report. The average attend-

ance for September was 66. He had 5 worship services; 2 church meetings; 10 Bible studies and other classes; 3 member visits; 4 Confirmation classes; 4 visitations with visitors; 2 shut-in visits; 12 hospital visits; and 14 counseling sessions. The Youth will be doing Trunk or Treat.

Deacon Chairman was absent—no report. Trustee Chairman, Mike said Chris is going to see that the swing set is constructed. Mike has donated two blowers and Don Haddock has donated two weed whackers. He is going to continue to clear out the debri and bushes under the pine trees and remove the shrubs in front of the church. Also, going to schedule a garage clean out day

Descriptions of Council Positions Open for Election ~~

VICE PRESIDENT—The Vice President shall: (1) Represent the President when the latter is unable to perform his duties and, furthermore, should the office of the President be vacated for any reason, the Vice President will assume the office of the President, until the next Voter's Assembly meeting; (2) Serve as parliamentarian at all meetings of the Church Council and Voter's Assembly; (3) Make an annual report to the Voter's Assembly of his activities.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY—The Financial Secretary shall: (1) Record the contributions of the giving units of the congregation; (2) Supervise the counting of the contributions and cause them to be deposited in a designated bank; (3) Issue an annual statement of contributions to the giving units of the congregations; (4) Order, prepare, and distribute the offering envelopes; (5) Serve as a member of the Board of Stewardship.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CHAIR-

MAN—The Board shall consist of the Chairman and four (or more) members. They shall: (a) Foster spiritual growth in and through the congregation; (b) Set up adequate objectives for every age level, agency and organization,

embracing training in Christian knowledge. attitudes, and skills, such as use of the Bible, witnessing, prayer, giving, and Christian family living; (c) Provide an adequate amount of learning opportunities for such objectives to be utilized at all age levels; (d) Select curricula so that the objectives for each agency and age level can be carried out in a Christian and God-pleasing manner; (e) Establish and maintain a church library; (f) Organize and conduct a summer education program; (g) Encourage individuals of all ages to utilize the church's education programs; (h) Select responsible personnel and provide them with the proper training necessary in order to equip them for their assigned duties; (i) Give attention to enrollment and attendance of pupils as well as to their personal development and growth; (j) Constantly be seeking new ways to involve more people in these programs and keep those already involved interested; (k) Subdivide and assign responsibilities to individuals or committees in order to facilitate proper consideration; (1) Delegate the administration of all educational agencies and work to board members or qualified persons (subject to the approval of the Church Council); (m) Deposit all contributions and funds

through the Financial Secretary and; (n) Submit an annual budget to the Board of Stewardship as requested by that Board.

MISSIONS CHAIRMAN—The Board shall consist of the Chairman and four (or more) members. They shall: (a) Assist the Pastor in the entire program of proclaiming the Gospel to all people; (b) Plan, promote, and carry out an evangelism program in the congregation and in the community, i.e., planning and supervising surveys, maintaining evangelism files, and enlisting assistance in visiting prospective members of the church; (c) Assist the Pastor in training the laity to bring the unchurched to the Pastor's instruction class; (d) Be concerned with the reception, orientation, and integration of new members into the congregational programs and review their progress (e) Recommend ways to incorporate evangelism into all aspects of the church's programs; (f) Endeavor to publicize the Gospel and the activities of the congregation by the various modern


methods available; (g) Call to the attention of the congregation the welfare agencies and efforts being conducted by the church and hereby solicit support for them; (h) Report on the social needs of the community and solicit the congregation's cooperation with other agencies in the community endeavoring to help meet their needs; and (i) Submit an annual budget to the Board of Stewardship as requested by that Board.

BOARD OF FELLOWSHIP—SPECIAL

EVENTS: Shall consist of a chairman and the members of the Lutheran Women of Good Shepherd. The events consist of, but are not limited to: (a) Farewell Dinners;; (b) Installation Receptions; (c) Welcome Dinners; (d) Anniversary Reception/Dinner; (e) Valentine Sweetheart Dinner (f) Easter Breakfast; (g) Confirmation Reception; (h) Graduation Reception (i) Stewardship Dinner; (j) Community Band Performance Reception; (k) Soup & Sandwich Suppers before Lent, Advent and Christmas Decorating.
