

Exodus 24:11

the chief men of the people of Israel; they beheld God, and ate and drank.

Throughout the Bible and throughout history, people have sat down to eat and drink together. Mainly it was done because we need to eat and drink in order to live. In this section of Scripture, God called Moses and the leaders of the people up to the summit of Mount Sinai. The leaders of the people were afraid that God would strike them dead but instead they sat, ate and drank in the presence of the Lord. In Biblical times and in the Middle East today eating and drinking with someone means that you are pledging your friendship, offering protection and that your relationship is or will be right again.

When God called Moses and the leaders to come up the mountain, God was signaling that the relationship between God and His people was strong. They had nothing to fear from Him.

At the celebration of Passover, Jesus sat with his disciples and ate and drank with "And He did not lay his hand on them. He instituted the Lord's Supper for our forgiveness and to strengthen our faith. By faith, our relationship with Christ is right and we have nothing to fear from Him. After Easter, Jesus prepared breakfast for Himself and the disciples on the beach. This was after they fled the night He was betrayed and arrested. That breakfast, prepared by our Lord, was a signal to the disciples that His relationship with them was strong. It was not strong because of what they have done but because of what He had

Chris Johnson called the meeting to order and Pastor Daene said a prayer. Chris then welcomed Mark Ploss to the Council.

Minutes were reviewed and approved.

As we do not have a Financial Secretary as of yet; Joyce was nice enough to print the reports for us. Giving in January was down from last year over \$5,000. 2019 January offerings were \$10,087.10.

We did not have a report from Treasurer, Angela Coy.

Pastor reported attendance was off a little on January 20th. He had 4 Church services;
