

The Meeting was opened with a prayer.

The February minutes were reviewed and approved as written.

The Financial Secretary's report was reviewed. Offerings for February was \$15,085.50. YTD income is down compared to 2018

Treasurer's report shows that as of the end of February we were negative \$320.00 actual income to expenses.

Pastor did not have a written report but said that Confirmation is on hold for now. He will have a full report at April's Council meeting.
