From the Pastor

"For through the law I died to the law so that I might live for God. I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!" Galatians 2:19-21

I think we have all heard the idea in one form or another that if you work hard enough, you will succeed. A similar idea is expressed in the idea that if you never give up, you will eventually succeed. So many self-help books, cliché ridden plaques and other such items express this idea. Here is the problem with that line of thinking. You don't always succeed, and some things are impossible to do no matter how much effort you put into it. For example, at my age now, if I was determined to play in the NFL and worked out every day as much as I could, I would never be in good enough shape to make an NFL team. While that might be the stuff of movies, reality is different than Hollywood.

After the Babylonian exile, the Israelites thought that if they kept the law better and even strove for perfection, then they would

never go into exile again and everything would prosper in Israel. They figured their fickle attitude towards God's law is what got them into trouble. This time would be different if they strove for close adherence to the law. The olive grove and vineyards would be plentiful, and flocks would grow. It all depended if they tried hard enough to keep the law. By the time Jesus started His earthly ministry, perfect adherence to the way they understood the law was paramount. They totally failed to see that it was something impossible to do.

Christians can never be perfect, and we never claim to be perfect or that we will attain perfection on this earth. A man I know told me many times, "I only expect perfection when I achieve it first". We have to totally rely on Christ because we can't keep God's Law perfectly. We cannot stand before the Father and explain we earned heaven by what we have done. There is also a very practical everyday application of this fact about not being able to keep God's law perfectly. Since we are imperfect, so is everyone else. That fact should help to show patience when others make mistakes, say something cruel, or whatever else. As Christ has shown mercy to me, so too, should we show mercy to others.
