From the Pastor

The end of October is always an exciting time for Lutherans as we celebrate the Reformation. The Reformation changed the Roman Catholic Church as well as started the growth of many denominations. The ideas of the Reformation would later influence the great thinkers in Europe and that would spawn the American Revolution but that is a tale for another day. The Lutheran Church is centered on the ideas of Faith Alone and Scripture Alone. Those two doctrines set us apart from other denominations.

We believe that we are saved by faith alone. Some teach you must have faith and do good works to go to heaven. We teach that we do good works in response to what Christ has already done for us. How sad it is for those who think their works get them into heaven because how can you ever know if you have done enough? Scripture alone sets us apart too. We do not accept the decisions of any church body or individual or tradition as being equal to Scripture. Lutherans do not try to explain things that Scripture does not directly address. For example, we do

not try to answer how Christ can be present in the Lord's Supper when it still looks and tastes like wine and bread. When we try to explain what Scripture does not explain, our man-made ideas will always pollute the pure Word of God. John 20:31 tells us, "But these have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name." We don't need to explain or understand everything to be saved.

When we celebrate Reformation Sunday, we celebrate the salvation bought for us by the death and resurrection of Christ. There is no other way to heaven except by the death and resurrection of Christ. We pity those who believe all religions lead to the same God. Scripture tells us it is by Christ alone through faith alone which alone saves us.
