# From the Pastor

How is your prayer life? That is not a question that we ask often but it is an important question. I am sure, myself included, that we wish we spent more time in prayer or that our prayer time could improve. The problem is that life never seems to slow down enough to spend that important time. We can get bombarded with a host of pressures and activities but we keep waiting for that time when things will slow down a bit.

Too often, we are like Martha in the Gospel who gets so worked up about serving the Lord that she forgets what is truly important. Her sister Mary understands that conversation and learning from Jesus is more important than if the bread is baked just right or if the plate of food is arranged just so. Finally Jesus says,

""Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

It is not that we do not have enough time, it is a matter of priorities. When I taught school, the student's assignments were done on Monday. During March Madness or the NFL playoffs, students would ask for more time because "something came up" or they ran out of time. They had the

whole week to complete the assignment but yet they "ran out of time". It was a matter of priorities and the assignment was a lesser one.

What greater use of time can there be than to spend some time reading His Word, pondering the meaning of it, and spending some time in prayer with him. Paul says to the Colossians, "Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful, as you pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains." When we don't pray, we also are not praying for the needs of other people. Throughout His Word, we see where the prayers of people have influenced how things transpired.

Prayer is for our benefit as it is time to enrich our relationship with Christ and to lift the requests of others. Great things happen when a person prays, not only for themselves but for those with whom they join their voices in asking God for what we need.

# Church Council Highlights ~~

Good Shepherd Church Council met on January 12, 2020 at 11:10 a.m. Those present were Chris Johnson, Michelle Pierce, Brad Pierce, Pastor Daene, Mark Ploss, Larry Hill, Kevin Weber, Johannah Pollert, Randy Powers, Gerda Martin and Heidi Baca. Those absent were Angela Coy and Dan Bonham.

Chris Johnson called the meeting to order and asked Pastor to say a prayer.

The minutes were reviewed and accepted as written.

Brad Pierce, Financial Secretary presented the income for December as \$17,092.00.

Treasurer's Report stated the expenses for December as \$12,417.48.

Pastor reported the average attendance for the five regular services as 72. We had 12 services in December. Pastor attended one church meeting; had 12 Bible Studies/other classes; visited 3 members; visited 2 visitors; had 1 Shut-in visit; 5 hospital visits; 3 Counseling sessions; and one Funeral. Confirmation Class is back from Christmas break. The three in the class now all meet on Wednesday evenings at 5:30 p.m.

Deacon Chairman had no report.

Trustee Chairman (vacant) had no report. But Larry stated the hot water tank is leaking and will need to be replaced soon.

Board of Christian Education report stated in December the children rehearsed for the Children's Christmas Program.

Twelve children participated this year on December 15. Linda Haddock and Michelle Coner lead the Children's Church on non-communion Sundays. The children visit the nursing home on the 2nd Sunday of the month.

Board of Missions reported that we collected Thanksgiving food for the Food Pantry in November. In December we had two families for our Angel Tree. The gifts were wrapped on the 16th and the

families came and picked them up on the 17th. The families were very appreciative for the gifts we provided.

Board of Fellowships Report stated there was no expense for December. With all the donations for events they only spent \$96.97 for 2019.

The Council welcomed Brad Pierce as our new Financial Secretary for the one year term left in that rotation of officers.

Larry Hill has stepped up to be our new Treasurer. Open positions on the Church Council are now; Trustee Chairman and Stewardship Chairman. Anyone interested in these positions see Chris Johnson.

A Security Committee is being formed to evaluate the security we have and what we may need for the safety of our congregation.

Due to a conflict, our February Council Meeting will be on Sunday, February 16th after our worship service.


# Soup & Sandwich
