We often hear from fellow Christians that we must be "born again". In John 3, we read, In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again." "How can a man be born when he is old?' Nicodemus asked. "Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!" Is "you must be born again" a factual statement or a command? Actually, it is both. God the Father began the process when He sent His Son Jesus to die for our sins. Now forgiveness is offered to all. Then His Spirit opens our hearts to understand this: The perfect Son of God died in our place so we would not perish but instead would have eternal life. Through faith we respond to the good news of who Jesus is and what He did for us. This is more than just head acknowledge. All the while, He is teaching them how they must be born again. All the signs and miracles and parables were meant to bring people into a saving relationship with Him.

The meeting was called to order by Chris and Pastor gave a prayer.

The minutes were reviewed and approved with a correction.

Rose, Financial Secretary, gave her report of the offerings for March were \$14,643.26.

Some history of Memorial Day ~~

The Civil War ended in the Spring of 1865. It claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries, By the 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime tributes to the countless fallen soldiers. One of the earliest Memorial Day commemorations was organized by a group of freed slaves in Charleston, South Carolina less than a month after the Confederacy surrendered in 1865.

On May 5, 1868 General John A. Logan,

leader of an organization for Northern Civil War Veterans, called for a nation-wide day of remembrance later that month. The 30th of May 1868 was designated for the purpose of strewing flowers, or decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country. The date was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle and was named Decoration Day in honor of those lost in the Civil War. But after World War I the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars.

For decades, Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30, the date General Logan selected for the first Declaration Day. But in 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees; the change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday. Did you know each year on Memorial Day a national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 p.m.?
