God forgets. Here is a thought we do not think about much. We can forgive and try to forget but we always remember it to some degree. Psalm 103:2, "as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us." That is not the only place where it talks about God forgetting our sin. Isaiah 43:25 says, "I, I am he who blots out your transgressions for my own sake, and I will not remember your sins." Here is yet another verse that talks about God forgetting, Jeremiah 31:34 "And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saving, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."


When God forgives us our sins, they are removed from us. It is like they did not exist. It is only old Satan who keeps tapping us on the shoulder and asking, "Don't you remember when...?" He tempts us to remember the past sinful things we have done and especially the hurtful things others have done to us. Satan loves the Middle Eastern concept of forgiveness. You do not forgive until the other person corrects the wrong done to you. That wrong can go back generations. Therefore, there is no true forgiveness. There is only bitter recall.

God's way is different. He separates our sin from us and separates them as far as possible. Micah 7:19 says, "He will again have compassion on us: he will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea." Man cannot get to the depths of the seas in its' deepest places. That is why God uses that picture. Notice too, God has compassion on us. He does that again and again. He continually seeks us out and reminds that we are forgiven. We have nothing to fear from questions, "Don't remember when?" Instead we should reply to that question, "Yes, I remember God forgave me and forgets about it".


