Church Council met on October 9, 2022 after our worship service. Johannah presented the minutes and they were approved.

Rose, Financial Secretary, gave the income in September as \$13,766.90 of which included the mortgage reduction giving of \$2,595.00.

Expenses for September reported by Larry were \$14,525.31.

Pastor reported that we averaged 53 in service attendance. He had 4 worship services; 9 bible studies; 12 Counseling sessions; 3 Member visits; 2 Visiting the visitors; and 1 Shut-in visit. We do not have any Confirmation students.

The city of Franklin is having a community Trunk or Treat and we are thinking about participating in that. Asked for a vote and approved.
