# Church Council Highlights ~~

Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Council met o March 19, 2023. The meeting was called to order by Council Secretary, Johannah Pollert.

Those in attendance were: Kevin Weber, Don Haddock, Pastor Daene, Heidi Baca Johannah Pollert, Larry Hill, Michelle Walker, Shelley Hill, Randy Powers and Rose Krimmel. Those absent were: Gerda Martin, Amy Houck and Kent Krimmel.

The minutes were presented by Johannah Pollert, Council Secretary, from our meeting in February. After review they were approved.

Rose Krimmel, Financial Secretary, presented the income for February as \$13,686.36.

Larry Hill, Treasurer stated expenses for February were \$11,048.64.

Pastor reported he had 5 Church services, 8 Bible Studies, 4 Visits; 4 Hospital visits; 16 Counseling sessions and visited 4 Shut-ins. The average attendance for February was 55.

Deacon Chairman, Kevin Weber, had no report.

Trustee, Chairman, Don Haddock, said he did not do a report as everything is as he reported last month other than he is planning Clean up like he did in the Fall (a list of things that needed to be done and you choose what you want to do and sign off when you have it completed.) Imperial Water is coming and doing a yearly check up on our water system equipment.

Christian Education, Heidi Baca Chair, reported the Preschool Class lead by Johannah Pollert is studying the New Testament and the Intermediate Class lead by Rachel Runge, is studying Confirmation Concepts. Linda Haddock leads Children Church on non –Communion Sundays.

Stewardship Chair, Shelley Hill, had n0 report.

Michelle Walker, Missions Chair, reported that during the month of March we are collecting small microwaveable meals and applesauce for the InterChurch Food Pantry. Also, as a member of the Flower & Banner committee the Lilies to decorate the chancel are \$17.00 each this year. A sign-up sheet for those who wish to purchase lilies is on the bulletin board.
