

"How the mighty have fallen in battle! Jonathan lies slain on your heights. I grieve for you, Jonathan my brother; you were very dear to me. Your love for me was wonderful, more wonderful than that of women. "How the mighty have fallen! The weapons of war have perished!" (Samuel 1: 25-27)

David said these words after his close friend Jonathan was killed in battle. Let's briefly look at the life of King Saul, Jonathan's father. When I think of fallen people, my mind returns to an ancient example, King Saul, the tall, dark, handsome monarch of the Hebrews. What an impressive specimen of humanity! He was the one of whom the Lord had said to Samuel, "Behold the man of whom I spoke to you! This one shall rule over My people" (1 Sam 9:17). With humility and genuine reluc-

tance Saul accepted the appointment, acknowledged God's anointing, and graciously stood before the cheering masses as Samuel announced: "Do you see him whom the LORD has chosen? Surely there is no one like him among all the people." So all the people shouted and said, "Long live the king!" (1 Sam. 10:24) Saul started his reign as a good Godly king. However he became corrupted over time and fell from Grace. Can you imagine what was said about him at his funeral? Compare his life to Jonathan and what David had to say of his friend. 

Church Council Highlights ~~

Good Shepherd Church Council met on May 7th due to Mother's Day on the second Sunday. Those in attendance were: Johannah Pollert, Heidi Baca, Kevin Weber, Pastor Daene, Don Haddock, Larry Hill, Kent Krimmel, Shelley Hill, Michelle Walker, Brian Walker, Rose Krimmel and guests Mark & Robin Waldron. Those absent were Gerda Martin, Amy Houck and Randy Powers.

Brian Walker, President, called the meeting to order. He gave the Council a brief summary of his past work history and family.

Pastor said a prayer and everyone in attendance signed the attendance sheet.

Johannah Pollert, Secretary, presented the March and April minutes. March minutes were approved with corrections and April minutes were approved as presented.

Financial Secretary, Rose Krimmel stated offerings and other income was \$21,524.44 (included is \$740 memorials for Ginny

Hill.)

Larry Hill, Treasurer, reported that March expenses were \$14,405.54 and April expenses were \$14,303.87.

Pastor Daene reported in March & April he had: 9 Church services, 17 Bible studies; 3 Visits, 3 Visits to visitors, 4 Hospital visits, 16 Counseling sessions, 4 Shut-in visits, 1 Private instruction, 1 Private baptism, and 1 Funeral.

Kevin Weber, Deacon chair, had no report. Don Haddock, Trustee chair, said a new water treatment pump was installed during the inspection of the water system. Trimming maintenance continues to be done. Doug, Troy and a friend of Troy's helped Don clean up all the branches blown down during the tornado, volunteers continue to do routine cleaning, another list will be posted in the next couple months for deep cleaning. Volunteers from Franklin High School with Randy & Elaine's guidance cleaned the Sanctuary on April 29th.

Heidi Baca, Education chair reported the Sunday School class VBS will be a 3 day session (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday morning) June 9, 10, 11.

Stewardship chair, Shelley Hill, had no report.

Mission chair, Michelle Walker, stated in May we are collecting canned vegetables and canned fruit for the InterChurch Food Pantry. Ride Share Program is available for anyone needing a ride to & from Church.

Gerda Martin, Amy Houck, Fellowship Co-chairs, no report.

Kent Krimmel, Member-at-Large stated he did not have a report but he will not be available the beginning of July.

No unfinished business and no new business to discuss. Motion to adjourn.
